1	<p><u>Introduction to Automobile & Automobile Performance:</u> Development of automobile, classification of automobiles, main parts of automobiles, vehicle assemblies, specifying an automobile, resistance to the motion of the vehicle, power required for propulsion of the vehicle, power required for acceleration, effect of different drives like front wheel/rear wheel/for wheel drive, stability of a vehicle on a slope, dynamics of a vehicle running on banked track.</p> <p><u>Chassis, Frame & Body:</u> Types of frames, engine location, Comparison of front and rear mounting of engine. Rear, front and four wheel drives, their relative merits, types of chassis, types of bodies & their construction.</p>	05
2	<p><u>Transmission System: Clutch:</u> Necessity and requirements of clutch, review of constructional features and working of different types of clutch, calculation of surface area and number of driving and driven plates, fluid coupling.</p> <p><u>Gear Box:</u> Functions and need of gear box, gears & gear ratios, types of manual gear boxes, automatic transmission, epicyclic gearing, torque converter, free wheel clutch, semi/fully automatic transmission, continuously variable transmission (CVT).</p> <p><u>Propeller Shaft, Differential and Rear axle:</u> Propeller shafts and their types, hotchkiss drive, torque tube drive, whirling of propeller shaft. Principle of the differential, limited slip differential, rear axle</p> <p><u>Wheels & Tyres :</u> Types of wheels, wheel dimensions, types of tyres, tread design, tyre section, designations, wear</p>	12

3	<u>Steering System:</u> Steering layout, types of steering gears, steering linkages, steering mechanism, definitions and significance of camber, caster, king pin inclination, toe in and toe out on turn, measurement and adjustment of various steering system layouts, steering ratio, under steering and over steering, power assisted steering, steering geometry, checking wheel alignment and steering geometry, computerized wheel alignment equipment.	06
4	<u>Suspension System:</u> Principle, type of suspension system, conventional and independent front and rear axle, spring, rubber and air suspensions, automatic/hydro suspension system, shock absorbers.	04
5	<u>Brakes:</u> Principle, braking distance, braking efficiency, weight transfer, wheel skidding, principle and working of various types of brakes, power assisted brakes, and power operated brakes, anti-lock brake systems (ABS), diagnosis of faults, adjustment and maintenance of brakes.	06
6	<u>Battery, Lighting System , Accessories and Safety System : Battery:</u> Construction, working, methods of rating, faults, charging methods, test, generator and cranking motor with drive purpose, construction, faults and diagnosis, voltage and current regulator, purpose, typical circuit, layout, working principle, voltage setting. <u>Lighting system:</u> Wiring system, head lights, aiming of head lights, indicating lights. <u>Accessories</u> like direction indicators, hazard flashes, horn, speedometer, tachometer, wind screen wiper, wind screen washer, central locking system, power windows, and vehicle tracking system. <u>Safety provisions</u> in an Automobile	06
